

View campus map











Take in the City




Wander and Wonder



If guests are looking for some fresh air and the chance to sightsee, the Roman relic Hadrian's Wall is a bus journey away. The seaside village of Tynemouth is a 22 minute Metro trip from the city centre and offers guests a chance to relax in this scenic setting.

Discover and Explore



There are plenty of museums and historical sites of interest throughout the city, including the City's namesake castle and the Discovery Museum. The Centre for Life is based near the main station and the free BALTIC Centre for Contemporary art is a bridge-walk across the river.





HOW TO GET AROUND

Newcastle is a small city that is easy to navigate on foot but it has many accessible transport links too

- <u>Metro</u> Travel around the city centre and other useful locations. Haymarket is the closest station for the University. It is £5.70 for an all-zones Daysaver ticket.
- Newcastle Airport 20 Minutes drive to the city centre.
- Newcastle Central Station 10 Minutes walk to Newcastle University main campus.
- Multiple Bus routes
- Cycle friendly city
- By car Newcastle is easily accessible by road via the A1 from the north and south and the A69 from the west. Limited parking is available on site, this is paid for via the Pay By Phone app
- Taxi Services Uber and Bolt Services are available around the city as well as budget taxis such as Radar, East Coast and Blueline.
- Newly introduced Neuron E-Scooters are a useful way to get around the city quickly (Note these cannot be used directly on campus).
